## **Everest Conqueror Dickinson is the Real Deal**

Netherhall School students were treated to the real deal recently, with a visit from Everest conqueror and published author Matt Dickinson.

On the afternoon of Thursday 16<sup>th</sup> November, students from years 7, 8 and 9 had the opportunity to listen to tales of Matt's adventures up Earth's highest mountain above sea level. Located in the Mahalangur Himal sub-range of the Himalayas, Everest attracts many climbers, including highly experienced mountaineers like Matt who was one of the climbers caught in the 1996 climbing disaster. Through a series of photographs and video clips, and with the students hanging onto his every word, Matt retold several stories from his encounter with Everest.

In the pre-monsoon Everest season of 1996, amid the worst weather conditions on record, Dickinson made a successful ascent of Mount Everest's notorious North Face, one of the most technically demanding climbs on the world's highest peak, beating hurricane-force winds and temperatures of minus 70 degrees Celsius. Three of the eight deaths on Everest that day were on the North Face. He was climbing further up Everest when he came across the famous 'Green Boots' – he was confused why someone would have fallen asleep on the north face of Everest but it was soon to occur to him that this body was no longer alive. It was an Indian climber that was separated from the rest of his team in 1996 and was found for the first time.

Since his travels, Matt has worked with individuals such as Bear Grylls and has become a published author, enjoying success with his trilogy *Mortal Chaos* and *The Everest Files*. The students had a fantastic time and really enjoyed Matt's company. The school hopes to work with Matt again in the near future, so watch this space.

# Attendance at Netherhall

Parents and carers are legally responsible for ensuring that their children receive a full time education.

#### Mrs Telford is the School Attendance Officer and can be contacted on 01900 813434 ext.200

Good, regular attendance and punctuality is expected of <u>every student</u>. Students should be in school by 8.30am each morning and be lined up quietly outside their registration room or assembly by 8.30am. Punctuality is an important part of self discipline and is essential to good time management. All lateness is recorded and sanctions given. If a student arrives AFTER 8.55am he/she will need to register with Mrs Telford in her office.



Netherhall School operates a <u>colour band system</u> to encourage and reward good attendance and to closely monitor and address poor attendance, in liaison with Children's Services and the County Inclusion Officer where necessary.

We ask that parents:

\* <u>do not make dental/medical appointments during school time</u> where possible or to ensure their child attends part of the day where they can dental/medical appointments cards or letters will be required

\* <u>not take holidays during term-time</u> - the Headteacher cannot grant a leave of absence except in exceptional circumstances

\* <u>contact school straight away</u> if your child is feeling unwell - this must be done **EACH DAY OF ABSENCE** to ensure students are safeguarded

## It is the discretion of the school whether a student is sent home or any absence authorised.

Parents, students and governors will be <u>regularly informed</u> throughout the year of how well students are doing.

**Our attendance governor is Julie Walton** and she can be contacted through the Clerk to the Governors at school. She will be supporting the school with attendance interviews for students with attendance below 95%.

#### STATISTICS TO THINK ABOUT:

\* 95% attendance (1 day off every four weeks) gives students an 80% chance of achieving 5 A\*-C grades at GCSE.

\* For every 10% drop in attendance, a student is likely to achieve 1 less GCSE

\* 90% attendance (1 day off per fortnight) gives students a 60% chance of achieving 5 A\*-C grades at GCSE.

\* 85% attendance (1.5 days off per fortnight) gives students a 42% chance of achieving 5 A\*-C grades at GCSE.

\* 80% attendance all the way through school is the equivalent of missing a whole year of education.

\* 80% attendance means a student is missing 1 full day of education every week.
