Managing Medication Procedures - Important information for parents/carers

We recognise that from time to time students may require medication within the school day. However, we do have to adhere to guidelines to ensure the safety of our students. With this in mind, we would like to point out some procedures that we must follow:

- Some students may need to take prescribed medicines during their time in school. This will usually only be for a short time period, e.g. to finish a course of antibiotics. Parents/guardians must come into school and arrange this with reception.
- Children should not be sent to school with their own medicine (prescribed or non-prescribed) as this poses a health and safety risk to other children.
- Staff will not administer non-prescribed medication i.e. paracetamol, unless there are exceptional circumstances and where there is specific prior written permission from a parent/guardian.
- If a child suffers regularly from frequent or acute pain parents should refer the matter to their child's GP.

Parents/guardians have the prime responsibility for their child's health and should provide the school with timely, complete information about their child's medical condition. If your child has a medical condition that we do not know about, please contact the school, your child's Head of Year or Mrs C Savage (Assistant SENCO).

Netherhall School 2016-17 Awards Presentation

This year's Netherhall School 2016-17 Awards Presentation took place on Thursday, 13th July 2017. The awards presentation featured student performance by the guitar group, gymnastics team, vocal performance by Holly Goodger and special guest – Paralympian, Simon Lawson.

Simon Lawson



Simon is a born and bred Maryport lad, a leading light in the local community and a former student of Netherhall School who has represented Great Britain in moto-cross and in the wheelchair marathon at the highest level and on the world's greatest sporting stage, the Olympics.

Simon is testimony to bravery, endeavour, self-belief and tenacity. He is a role model to others, a champion and an enduring example of how to battle adversity with dignity, humility, courage and success.

Simon was a top-class, British moto-cross school boy champion; 16 years ago, Simon suffered a catastrophic accident whilst competing which nearly killed him, severing his spinal cord and paralysing him from the chest downwards - It was doubtful that Simon would survive the accident.

His spirit pulled him through. He battled back from the most difficult of circumstances, relentless in his endeavour, tireless in his energy, dedicated and uncompromising in his belief. He currently trains six days a week, building strength in the gym and riding hundreds of miles every week on the roads around Maryport.

Simon travels the globe competing against the world's best athletes in some of the most iconic locations in the top-flight of wheelchair marathon competitions. The pinnacle of his recent achievement was to be selected to represent Great Britain at the recent Paralympics, held in Rio, Brazil in 2016.

Last year, I was privileged to be asked to be part of the welcome home parade and civic reception, to acknowledge and honour Simon's achievement. Personally, I had never experienced such warmth, support and appreciation, as Maryport showed its pride in one of its favourite sons.

Netherhall School is incredibly lucky to have a person of the calibre of Simon as one of its former students, as a role model and inspiration for today's students.

- 6th place in the Boston Marathon
- 10th position in the 2015 World Championship Marathon
- 10th place in the 2016 World Championship Marathon

Netherhall School's Young Leaders Pathway

At Netherhall School we are committed to encouraging young people to take personal responsibility and develop leadership skills. These skills include self- organisation, reliability, self-confidence, self- esteem, planning and self- review.

In October 2016, sixteen young people (plus 6 teachers from primary schools) attended a Young Gymnastic Judging course which enabled them to judge at the primary school gymnastic competition and assist at after school gym clubs. Three of these judges, Kelly Pearce, Leah McCardle and Lauren Pape in Year 12, went on to judge at the Cumbria Key Steps final in Penrith.

In March 2017, twenty young people attended a Netball Young Organisers course where they learned how to organise and deliver netball sessions and referee matches. They have since umpired Year 7 & 8 netball tournaments taking place over eight weeks at lunchtimes and a Maryport High 5 primary festival.

In April 2017, ten Year 8 pupils gave up their Sunday to attend a Tennis Young Leaders course which trained them to deliver tennis sessions, organise and umpire tennis matches. These young people attended and officiated at the Maryport Mini Tennis festival and the County Mini Tennis final in Carlisle in July.

In May/June 2017, ten Year 12 students were registered on a Sports Leader UK Level 2 course. This accreditation allows these young people to organise and deliver recreational and sporting activities to young people both within and outside of school.

In September 2017, our new Year 7 & 8 will be registered on a Sports Leader UK Young Leader course which will allow us to develop an effective and efficient leadership pathway from Year 6 – Year 13.

If you are keen to develop your leadership skills or are motivated to gain an accreditation recognised by the National Governing Bodies of sport, then please contact a member of the PE department who will be kept up to speed with leadership opportunities as courses become accessible throughout the year.




